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### III Class Personal Pronouns (cont.)

#### Ma- Actor Focus

In lesson 8 you learned how to use the III Class Personal Pronouns below in column I.. These pronouns are used to show possession. In this lesson you will learn how to use the pronouns in

column II. These pronouns show the BENEFICIARY or the DIRECTION of the action of the verb. The ha or kan added before the root pronoun makes it function like a prepositional phrase. The most commonly used English translations are: “to, at, for, with, or from” followed by the III Class pronoun.

### III CLASS PERSONAL PRONOUN VARIATIONS

I	II
akon	Ha akon
imo	Ha imo
iya	Ha iya
aton (incl)	Ha aton
amon (excl)	Ha amon
iyo	Ha iyo
ira	Ha ira

### Examples

ha akon (column II) -- “to (at, with, from) me”  
 “to (at, with, from) my...”

These III Class Pronouns show the beneficiary or the direction of the action of the verb.
